Toby is the founder of the Magnificent Men Mentoring Group, winner of the 2020 NJBIC Community Change Award, and provides workshops, seminars, group mentoring as well and performs community service since 2014. To date, thousands of male youth and adult males have benefited by their participation in their mobile programs. They have partnered with YMCA, PAL, Rikers Correctional Facility, and the New York City Public Library and Manhattan District Attorney’s office to name a few. In 2019 he launched the “Breakfast with Our Boy’s” Series an interactive conversation with 10 young men aged 10-15 years of age discussing topics important to their development as men. The organization has been featured on ABC Eyewitness News, Burlington County Times and Fox 29 Philadelphia, some of the topics discussed, include dining etiquette, financial literacy, dating, dos and don’ts, leadership, and professional presentation to name a few.
